**Mission** – the Alaska Association for Historic Preservation is dedicated to the preservation of Alaska’s prehistoric and historic heritage as manifested in its buildings and sites.

**Goals** –

- a) Promote communication with the general public in support of historic preservation in Alaska and develop a network of preservation supporters.
- b) Educate and inform the public about historic preservation through a quarterly newsletter, workshop, and other means.
- c) Initiate, monitor, and support legislation to promote historic preservation in Alaska.
- d) Provide assistance to local and statewide preservation projects.
- e) Serve as liaison between local, statewide, and national historic preservation groups.
- f) Establish an endowment to support historic preservation in Alaska.

**Alaska’s Most Endangered Properties & Sites** –

AAHP identifies Alaska’s most endangered properties and sites each year in an effort to increase public awareness of endangered historic properties. The list is usually announced during Historic Preservation Week in May. AAHP administers a matching grant program in conjunction with the Most Endangered list.

**AAHP’s Most Endangered Properties & Sites Preservation Grants** – Individuals or organizations whose historic properties are named to Alaska’s Most Endangered list in a given year are eligible to apply for assistance with preservation projects planned for the following year. Grants under this program are to be distributed to successful applicants for use in stabilization, pre-construction, or construction activities focused on the preservation of the properties with the aim to remove the causes which endanger them.
